Born in Toronto – and then married and settled in The Village of Thornhill, Ontario for 25 years. Thornhill (founded 1794) would have slowly been bulldozed, were it not for a local citizens group who successfully fought back, to preserve the quaint village it is today. Moving to Burlington in 2003 – it was obvious the same situation was in place, and Alan quickly took interest in the local history to ensure his new hometown would keep its built heritage.

Board member and past president of the **Burlington Historical Society** since 2007 to research and promote Burlington's history. Board member of **Friends of Freeman Station** since its inception in 2011 - to rescue, restore and promote the 1906 Grand Trunk Railway Burlington Junction Station. Active in the local art scene, leading historic downtown tours, and contributing on social media. Alan will share some of the history of the city and what Burlington is doing now to keep its heritage.


